What we do, Who We Are

Summer is the busiest time of the year for us! Kids are out of school, Lobster Fest is underway, maintenance and repairs and 2 new roofs are just a few of the things that keep us busy every day.

But what keeps us really busy is the number of families who suffer from intimate partner violence and their children who suffer with them.

We know that Kentucky leads the nation in victims of violence per capita. We know that domestic violence is the key indicator for crime in our state and in our country. We know that domestic violence causes millions of dollars in lost wages, loss of jobs, loss of housing, loss of health, education, and general stability. It is the reason for substance abuse, mental health issues, murder, suicide, and generational issues like poverty and high crime rates.

So, the question is, what can each of us do to prevent this from happening? Make referrals for your family, friends, and coworkers. Teach your children how to be safe, how to choose their friends, how to stop their friends from an unsafe party, by steering them home, or somewhere they will be safe. Teach our children that social media can be harmful when parents do not monitor it. Each one of us can make a difference. Each one of us can be part of the solution. Just say yes to end violence in our community. As we end this summer, we go into the month of October which is Domestic Violence Awareness month. This is when we advocate, educate and intervene. This is our Mission. This is Safe Harbor!
